## SISTERS OF CHARITY HEALTH SYSTEM BY THE NUMBERS

### Services, programs and ministries offered in the Central Neighborhood

#### ST. VINCENT CHARITY AND MISSION KITCHEN

- **10,000** items from the former St. Vincent Charity Medical Center were re-distributed to the community; furniture and medical supplies given to some of NEO's neediest.



- Last year, about **2,000** meals were served and roughly **800** distributions of canned goods and fresh produce were provided to Central residents.
- About **3,000** meals were provided and served at the Men's Shelter on Lakeside Ave.
- **HUNDREDS** of articles of clothing were also distributed to Mission Kitchen attendees.

#### OUTPATIENT PHARMACY

Over **10,000** patients served last year (farther reach than just the Central community)

#### INTERNAL MEDICINE

Over **2,700** patient encounters



#### ROSARY HALL

Rosary Hall offers outpatient addiction treatment services, outpatient mental health services, and medication assisted treatment. Over **1,000** individuals served last year; now located in a new space; and over **5,500** encounters last year through these Rosary Hall services.



#### CLEVELAND CENTRAL PROMISE NEIGHBORHOOD

- Promise, a collective impact initiative, is designed to address the Social Drivers of Health such as education, employment, and physical and mental health.
- Leadership development and neighborhood cohesiveness are also emphasized through programming, such as training over **90** Central Ambassadors; celebrating **120** Champions of Central; offering nutrition and cooking classes for kids through Jr. Chef; providing youth gardening training; and partnering to positively impact the students and families of Marion-Sterling, a neighborhood K-8 school.



### Faith-based services and care for the elderly

#### LIGHT OF HEARTS VILLA (Bedford)

- **100+** residents receive compassionate care annually, with 50% benefiting from financial assistance.
- **35** years of faith-based senior care
- Almost **\$500,000** raised in 2024, supporting residents who have outlived their resources, enhancing facilities, providing pastoral care and preserving our historic grounds.



#### REGINA HEALTH CENTER (Richfield)

- Served over **320** residents (**260+** in skilled nursing; **55+** in assisted living)
- Raised nearly **\$1 million** to support facility improvements and enhancements
- Ranked **#10** in Ohio in *Newsweek* magazine's "Best Nursing Homes," for a 50-99 bed facility.

### Education and services for children and families in our communities

#### THE EARLY CHILDHOOD RESOURCE CENTER (Canton)

- About **2,200** children served annually through the SPARK kindergarten readiness program; with over **15,000** home visits
- More than **700** services to fathers needing support; more than **1,100** parents served through parenting classes and cafes; over **2,500** children visiting inspiration station and library.
- Over **6,500** coaching sessions for childcare center administrators and staff.



#### SOUTH CAROLINA CENTER FOR FATHERS AND FAMILIES

- Served over **3,250** participants, a **30%** increase for the past year, serving fathers in all **46** counties of SC.
- Almost **\$500,000** of child support paid
- Over **\$1.4** million saved in incarceration
- **\$114 million** in potential contributions to the State of South Carolina



### Transitional housing services

#### JOSEPH & MARY'S HOME (medical respite for those experiencing homelessness)

- About **100** people annually served in the Joseph's & Mary's residences; and **40** people served in the community.
- Over **\$2.8M** raised for the New Home for Healing Campaign
- **90%** of program alumni remain stably housed.
